It's always a good time to explore nature, whether you walk, wheel or ride to school.

The Noongar calendar has six different seasons, giving you plenty to discover in the great outdoors!

Noongar means 'a person of the south-west of WA,' or the name for the 'original inhabitants of the south-west of WA'. Noongar boodja – country covers the entire south-western portion of WA.

The Noongar season 'Kambarang' is represented by the colour yellow and is a return to the hotter weather.

A rainbow of colour is on display through the many flowers that bloom during this time, including banksias, kangaroo paw and the 'moojar', or Australian Christmas Tree.

But beware of snakes during Kambarang! These reptiles start to appear again after hibernation.
