Because of Her, We Can! NAIDOC Week Walk

Because of Her, We Can! NAIDOC Week Walk 2018 was a community event celebrating the strong history of Noongar people.

Around 400 people of all ages and cultures joined in a 3.7km walk at Kent Street Weir. Walkers were able to learn some Noongar words and history along the way, and then treated to a bush tucker feast.

Kent Street Weir is one of Canning's premier walking and cycling locations. The event aimed to get people walking in a safe and inclusive community, and showcase the accessible dual access pathways, connecting to the city centre and public transport routes.

Because of Her, We Can! NAIDOC Week Walk was part of a series of diverse cultural events, encouraging the community to interact with the walking and cycling facilities in Canning.

Albany Commuter Choices Campaign

Albany's Commuter Choices Campaign encouraged residents to see walking and riding as every day, convenient transport choices for getting around Albany.

Incentives were provided to people who rode to City events and destinations. The "Ride-To" events were popular across a range of ages and abilities, from seniors to children, encouraging people to give walking and cycling a go.

More than 10 "Ride-To" activities were promoted, and 350 refreshment vouchers or free entries provided to those who rode.

Learn to Ride Workshops

Launched in May 2018, the City of Gosnells Learn to Ride free workshops were held fortnightly for eight weeks, with approximately 30 children and 30 adults attending each session. Children were able to learn riding skills in a fun, interactive outdoor setting.

The workshop actively involved parents, giving them the skills to continue to teach their children. Several parents found they had started riding again to be positive role models for their children – and they enjoyed it!

Let's Ride Program

The Town of Cambridge partnered with Bike Smart to deliver the highly engaging Let's Ride bike education program to local primary school students.

Let's Ride is easy for schools to roll out, with bikes and helmets available if needed. The program provides real life scenarios such as traffic lights and intersections, giving students experience in a range of riding conditions.

Feedback from students, teachers and parents has been overwhelmingly positive, with parents impressed with their children's improved riding skills and confidence.

Over the past two years 540 students and 20 classes have participated in the program.

Glow in the Dark Path and Explore Cockburn App

Glow in the Dark Paths have been installed on dark sections of the coastal shared path – the first glow paths in WA. The glow in the dark Moon Deck treatment helps activate the shared paths at night by enabling walkers, runners and bike riders to find their way and feel safer.

The Moon Deck has been well supported by the local community and received significant positive feedback.

Improved facilities are to be supported by a new app, Explore Cockburn, to be launched soon. This user-friendly app will provide maps highlighting the Moon Deck sections and bike trails to key destinations in Cockburn.
